#### The Gospel According to John

#### 7-29-2020

1. Last week I taught in part Joh 11:29-41. Before we complete that study, I want to give you opportunity to use 1Jo 1:9 as may or may not be necessary.

2. I want to review some of that learned last week and then begin new material at point six on page four.

### The Book of Isaiah

1. The book was written by Isaiah in about 700 B.C. from Judah.

2. The grandest of all the Hebrew prophets, Isaiah speaks to the southern Kingdom and its immediate needs while prophesying of the sufferings of Christ and His ultimate victory at the 2nd Advent including specifics concerning His reign during the Millennium.

3. Last week when the clock tolled 8:45 P.M. we were in the process of studying several Messianic Prophecies found in the Book of Isaiah.

3.1 The glory of the coming kingdom

3.2 The joyful reign of Christ in the Kingdom

3.3 The rule of Christ over the world

3.4 Christ as a descendant of Jesse and David

- 3.5 Christ to be filled with the Spirit
- 3.6 Christ to judge with righteousness and justice

3.7 Christ to recover the remnant of his people from the islands of the sea.

Isa 11:11 And it shall come to pass in that day, that the Lord shall set his hand again the second time to recover the remnant of his people, which shall be left, from Assyria, and from Egypt, and from Pathros, and from Cush, and from Elam, and from Shinar, and from Hamath, and from the <u>islands of the sea</u>.

3.7.1 Islands of the sea refers to Gentile nations whose borders fall outside of those in the middle east; like for example the U.S. of A.

3.8 Let's review 6 other uses of "island/s" found in the Scripture.







Isa 13:22 And the wild beasts of the <u>islands</u> shall cry in their desolate houses, and dragons in their pleasant palaces: and her time is near to come, and her days shall not be prolonged.

Isa 42:12 Let them give glory unto the LORD, and declare his praise in the <u>islands</u>.

Isa 59:18 According to their deeds, accordingly he will repay, fury to his adversaries, recompence to his enemies; to the <u>islands</u> he will repay recompence.

Jer 50:39 Therefore the wild beasts of the desert with the wild beasts of the <u>islands</u> shall dwell there, and the owls shall dwell therein: and it shall be no more inhabited forever; neither shall it be dwelt in from generation to generation.

Rev 6:14 And the heaven departed as a scroll when it is rolled together; and every mountain and <u>island</u> were moved out of their places.

Rev 16:20 And every <u>island</u> fled away, and the mountains were not found. Rev 16:21 And there fell upon men a great hail out of heaven, every stone about the weight of a talent: and men blasphemed God because of the plague of the hail; for the plague thereof was exceeding great.

4. We then began an analysis of Joh 12:42-43.

## **Even the Chief Rulers Believed**

Joh 12:42 Nevertheless <u>among the chief rulers also many believed on him;</u> but because of the Pharisees they did not confess him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue:

Joh 12:43 For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.

5. It was my opinion the best way to teach Joh 12:42-43 was to review the *Doctrine of the Pharisee*.
