

Doctrine of Category V Love

1. Parents are responsible for training their children.

Pro 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

2. Parents must first learn doctrine before they can teach doctrine.

Deu 4:10 Remember the day that thou stoodest before the LORD thy God in Horeb, when the LORD said unto me, Gather me the people together, and I will make them hear my words, that they may learn to fear me all the days that they shall live upon the earth, and that they may teach their children.

3. Parents must be occupied with the Word and communicate it to their children as a natural product of everyday living.

Deu 6:6 These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts.
Deu 6:7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.

Deu 11:19 Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.

4. Capacity for blessing comes from doctrine, so be good to your children that they may be blessed of the Lord.

Deu 11:21 That your days may be multiplied, and the days of your children, in the land which the LORD swore unto your fathers to give them, as the days of heaven upon the earth.

5. Prosperity will be a great temptation to eschew your responsibility so teach them this song.

Deu 31:19 "Now write down for yourselves this song and teach it to the Israelites and have them sing it, so that it may be a witness for me against them.

Deu 31:20 When I have brought them into the land flowing with milk and honey, the land I promised on oath to their forefathers, and when they eat their fill and thrive, they will turn to other gods and worship them, rejecting me and breaking my covenant.

Deu 31:21 And when many disasters and difficulties come upon them, this song will testify against them, because it will not be forgotten by their descendants. I know what they are disposed to do, even before I bring them into the land I promised them on oath."

Deu 31:22 So Moses wrote down this song that day and taught it to the Israelites.

6. Parents should teach their children how to wage war so that they are ready at age 20 to serve in the military.

Jdg 3:1 Now these are the nations which the LORD left, to prove Israel by them, even as many of Israel as had not known all the wars of Canaan;

Jdg 3:2 Only that the generations of the children of Israel might know, to teach them war, at the least such as before knew nothing thereof;

Jdg 3:3 Namely, five lords of the Philistines, and all the Canaanites, and the Sidonians, and the Hivites that dwelt in mount Lebanon, from mount Baalhermon unto the entering in of Hamath.

Jdg 3:4 And they were to prove Israel by them, to know whether they would hearken unto the commandments of the LORD, which he commanded their fathers by the hand of Moses.

6.1 Women and children suffer most when a nation fails to maintain a strong military.

Jer 9:19 The sound of wailing is heard from Zion: 'How ruined we are! How great is our shame! We must leave our land because our houses are in ruins.'"

Jer 9:20 Now, O women, hear the word of the LORD; open your ears to the words of his mouth. Teach your daughters how to wail; teach one another a lament.

Jer 9:21 Death has climbed in through our windows and has entered our fortresses; it has cut off the children from the streets and the young men from the public squares.

6.2 Under the fifth cycle of discipline children also suffer greatly.

Lev 26:22 I will send wild animals against you, and they will rob you of your children, destroy your cattle and make you so few in number that your roads will be deserted.

Lev 26:23 "If in spite of these things you do not accept my correction but continue to be hostile toward me,

Lev 26:24 I myself will be hostile toward you and will afflict you for your sins seven times over.

7. Parents should and most often do rejoice in the accomplishments of their children.

Pro 23:24 The father of the righteous shall greatly rejoice: and he that begetteth a wise child shall have joy of him.

8. The man without children to inherit has little motivation at the end of his life.

Ecc 4:8 There was a man all alone; he had neither son nor brother. There was no end to his toil, yet his eyes were not content with his wealth. "For whom am I toiling," he asked, "and why am I depriving myself of enjoyment?" This too is meaningless -- a miserable business!

9. Children promoted and given responsibility without proper training and acquired maturity will fail. Children have to be eased into adulthood and their teachers should be the parents.

Isa 7:16 But before the boy knows enough to reject the wrong and choose the right, the land of the two kings you dread will be laid waste.

10. Parents are to provide for the physical needs of the child.

Mat 2:13 When they had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him."

Mat 2:14 So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, Mat 2:15 where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I called my son."

11. To protect the child properly they must know the Word. Parents must be the FLOT line for their children until they are old enough to build their own.

Mat 2:19 After Herod died, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt Mat 2:20 and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who were trying to take the child's life are dead."

Mat 2:21 So he got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel.

Mat 2:22 But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. Having been warned in a dream, he withdrew to the district of Galilee,

Mat 2:23 and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets: "He will be called a Nazarene."

12. Children without first the Living Word and then the Written Word may, and often do betray their parents. Mat 10:21 is first a Kingdom Age application but the verse does have secondary application to the Church Age saint.

Mat 10:21 "Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child; children will rebel against their parents and have them put to death.

13. Jesus grew physically, spiritually and intellectually because He rejected His diety and accepted the limitations of His humanity.

Luk 2:40 And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him.

Luk 2:46 After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions.

Luk 2:47 Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers.

14. Learning is a process for all of us but particularly for children. With His accepted limitations Jesus serves as an example of the necessity to learn.

Heb 5:8 Although he was a son, he learned obedience from what he suffered

Heb 5:9 and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him

Heb 5:10 and was designated by God to be high priest in the order of Melchizedek.

15. Women are given several curses: the birthing process and monthly periods, an initial desire for their fiance or potential husband even to the point of losing all reason, rulership of the husband over the wife and an inclination to rebel against that leadership. To minimize the damage of the curses she must from doctrine work out her salvation by following God's protocols.

Gen 3:16 To the woman he said, "I will greatly increase your pains in childbearing; with pain you will give birth to children. Your desire will be for your husband, and he will rule over you."

16. Mothers must be trained to love both their husbands and their children (even when they are doing right) because of the curses.

1Ti 2:11 A woman should learn in quietness and full submission.

1Ti 2:12 I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man; she must be silent.

1Ti 2:13 For Adam was formed first, then Eve.

1Ti 2:14 And Adam was not the one deceived; it was the woman who was deceived and became a sinner.

Tit 2:3 Likewise, teach the older women to be reverent in the way they live, not to be slanderers or addicted to much wine, but to teach what is good.

Tit 2:4 Then they can train the younger women to love their husbands and children,

Tit 2:5 to be self-controlled and pure, to be busy at home, to be kind, and to be subject to their husbands, so that no one will malign the word of God.

17. Similarly man must accordingly work out his own temporal salvation by following God's protocol.

Gen 3:17 To Adam he said, "Because you listened to your wife and ate from the tree about which I commanded you, 'You must not eat of it,' "Cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat of it all the days of your life.

Gen 3:18 It will produce thorns and thistles for you, and you will eat the plants of the field.

Gen 3:19 By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return."

Tit 2:1 You must teach what is in accord with sound doctrine.

Tit 2:2 Teach the older men to be temperate, worthy of respect, self-controlled, and sound in faith, in love and in endurance ...

Tit 2:6 Similarly, encourage the young men to be self-controlled.

Tit 2:7 In everything set them an example by doing what is good. In your teaching show integrity, seriousness

Tit 2:8 and soundness of speech that cannot be condemned, so that those who oppose you may be ashamed because they have nothing bad to say about us.

Tit 2:9 Teach slaves to be subject to their masters in everything, to try to please them, not to talk back to them,

Tit 2:10 and not to steal from them, but to show that they can be fully trusted, so that in every way they will make the teaching about God our Savior attractive.

18. Children are to obey their parents that they might prosper.

Eph 6:1 Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right.

Eph 6:2 Honour thy father and mother; which is the first commandment with promise;

Eph 6:3 That it may be well with thee, and thou mayest live long on the earth.

19. The above recited admonition is repeated in the book of Colossians. It would seem repetition is meant to emphasize. Notice also how the caveat to not provoke your children to wrath is also repeated in the book of Ephesians and Colossians.

Col 3:20 Children, obey your parents in all things: for this is well pleasing unto the Lord.

Eph 6:4 And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

Col 3:21 Fathers, provoke not your children to anger, lest they be discouraged.

20. The context is further made clear by Col 3:23 where we are instructed to do all things as unto the Lord. For those wondering Col 3:22 is a warning to slave to obey their masters.

Col 3:23 And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men;

Col 3:24 Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ.

Col 3:25 But he that doeth wrong shall receive for the wrong which he hath done: and there is no respect of persons.

21. Most parents start out adoring their children. There is something likeable about a baby. Perhaps it is their helplessness which brings out a certain nurturing quality in "normal people." However, it takes doctrine resident in the soul to be a good parent; being a loving parent often requires "tough love."

Gen 21:8 And the child grew, and was weaned: and Abraham made a great feast the same day that Isaac was weaned.

22. Parents have little to do with the fall of the DNA therefore you do the best you can with what you have received and by faith understand that God put the entire package together with you in mind.

1Th 5:18 In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.

Exo 2:6 And when she had opened it, she saw the child: and, behold, the babe wept. And she had compassion on him, and said, This is one of the Hebrews' children.

Exo 2:7 Then said his sister to Pharaoh's daughter, Shall I go and call to thee a nurse of the Hebrew women, that she may nurse the child for thee?

Exo 2:8 And Pharaoh's daughter said to her, Go. And the maid went and called the child's mother.

Exo 2:9 And Pharaoh's daughter said unto her, Take this child away, and nurse it for me, and I will give thee thy wages. And the woman took the child, and nursed it.

Exo 2:10 And the child grew, and she brought him unto Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son. And she called his name Moses: and she said, Because I drew him out of the water.

23. Discipline is good for all but absolutely necessary for children. Discipline of a child will solve a lot of future problems for the child.

Heb 12:6 For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth.

Heb 12:7 If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons; for what son is he whom the father chasteneth not?

Heb 12:8 But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons.

Heb 12:9 Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected us, and we gave them reverence: shall we not much rather be in subjection unto the Father of spirits, and live?

Heb 12:10 For they verily for a few days chastened us after their own pleasure; but he for our profit, that we might be partakers of his holiness.

Pro 23:13 Withhold not correction from the child: for if thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die.

Pro 23:14 Thou shalt beat him with the rod, and shalt deliver his soul from hell.

Pro 23:15 My son, if thine heart be wise, my heart shall rejoice, even mine.

23.1 Without discipline children will perform improperly and receive severe discipline from school, police, jail etc. Better the discipline at home rather than outside of the home.

24. Good parents teach the way of the Lord to their children but first they must know before they can teach.

Gen 18:19 For I have chosen him, so that he will direct his children and his household after him to keep the way of the LORD by doing what is right and just, so that the LORD will bring about for Abraham what he has promised him."

Heb 5:12 For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat.

Heb 5:13 For every one that useth milk is unskillful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe.

Heb 5:14 But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.

25. The love of siblings does not always last and sometimes never begins.

Psa 69:8 I am become a stranger unto my brethren, and an alien unto my mother's children.

26. Children who are trained in the Word will be successful even when their parents were failures and this includes military expertise.

Psa 78:5 He decreed statutes for Jacob and established the law in Israel, which he commanded our forefathers to teach their children,

Psa 78:6 so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children.

Psa 78:7 Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands.

Psa 78:8 They would not be like their forefathers -- a stubborn and rebellious generation, whose hearts were not loyal to God, whose spirits were not faithful to him.

Psa 78:9 The men of Ephraim, though armed with bows, turned back on the day of battle;

Psa 78:10 they did not keep God's covenant and refused to live by his law.

Psa 78:11 They forgot what he had done, the wonders he had shown them.

27. A good father loves his children compassionately like the Lord loves positive believers.

Psa 103:13 As a father has compassion on his children, so the LORD has compassion on those who fear him;

Psa 103:14 for he knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust.

27.1 The good father will recognize the frail nature of the child remembering as does the Lord that we all have an Old Sin Nature.

28. Fatherless children are a terrible curse to the land and God disciplines the land with the natural result of that travesty.

Psa 109:9 Let his children be fatherless, and his wife a widow.

Psa 109:10 Let his children be continually vagabonds, and beg: let them seek their bread also out of their desolate places.

29. Children are a blessing from the Lord.

Psa 127:3 Lo, children are an heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is his reward.

Psa 127:4 As arrows are in the hand of a mighty man; so are children of the youth.
Psa 127:5 Happy is the man that hath his quiver full of them: they shall not be ashamed, but they shall speak with the enemies in the gate.

30. Solomon was appreciative of his parents who taught him doctrine.

Pro 4:1 Hear, ye children, the instruction of a father, and attend to know understanding.

Pro 4:2 For I give you good doctrine, forsake ye not my law.

Pro 4:3 For I was my father's son, tender and only beloved in the sight of my mother.

Pro 4:4 He taught me also, and said unto me, Let thine heart retain my words: keep my commandments, and live.

Pro 4:5 Get wisdom, get understanding: forget it not; neither decline from the words of my mouth.

Pro 4:6 Forsake her not, and she shall preserve thee: love her, and she shall keep thee.

31. The best thing a parent can do for his children is to cycle Bible doctrine.

Pro 14:26 In the fear of the LORD is strong confidence: and his children shall have a place of refuge.

Pro 14:27 The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, to depart from the snares of death.

Pro 20:7 The just man walketh in his integrity: his children are blessed after him.

32. Good parents will take care of their children.

Mat 7:11 If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?

33. A parent must be a skilled leader in dealing with their children. Both parents must always display cohesive front; never a divided front. Meet behind closed doors and decide what will be our decision: and then stick to it.

1Th 2:11 As ye know how we exhorted and comforted and charged every one of you, as a father doth his children,

1Th 2:12 That ye would walk worthy of God, who hath called you unto his kingdom and glory.

34. A good father will rule his household having his children in subjection.

1Ti 3:4 One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity;

1Ti 3:5 (For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?)
